History of the Organisation

Sonarpur Progatir Pathe (SPP) was founded in 2014 with a clear and compassionate vision-to serve the most vulnerable communities in the remote and underserved regions of West Bengal. The organization emerged from the collective commitment of a group of socially conscious alumni of the Ramakrishna Mission, Samaj Sevak Shikshana Mandir, Belur Math, Howrah. Inspired by the ideals of service, self-reliance, and human dignity, these individuals came together to create a platform that would translate values into meaningful grassroots action.

From its inception, SPP adopted a community-centric approach, recognizing that sustainable development cannot be imposed from outside but must grow from within. The organization prioritized awareness generation, sensitization, and the development of ownership among local populations. By actively involving communities in project planning and implementation, SPP ensured that its interventions were not only relevant but also enduring.

What began as a modest initiative gradually expanded into a multi-sectoral development organization. Over the years, SPP extended its reach to 15 districts across West Bengal, addressing critical issues such as health, sanitation, education, livelihood, and skill development. Its strategy has consistently emphasized collaboration-with local governance bodies, government departments, institutional partners, and corporate entities-believing that collective effort is key to meaningful social transformation.

In the healthcare sector, SPP has made significant contributions, particularly in hard-to-reach areas like the Sundarbans. Through initiatives such as Free Medical Camps, Special Medical Camps, and Health Awareness Programs, the organization has brought essential healthcare services-including radiology, pathology, and free medicines-to communities that otherwise lack access. A notable milestone has been the implementation of the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme across seven districts, demonstrating SPP's capacity to handle large-scale public health interventions.

One of its most impactful ongoing initiatives is the "Mother's Waiting Hut" project, designed to ensure safe delivery for pregnant women and proper care for newborns in remote regions. This reflects the organization's commitment to maternal and child health—an area often neglected in marginalized communities.

SPP has also addressed the nutritional needs of vulnerable populations. In collaboration with the State Bank of India, it currently supports 500 tuberculosis patients by providing nutritional food, thereby strengthening recovery outcomes and improving quality of life.

Beyond healthcare, the organization has remained deeply engaged in education, skill development, and water and sanitation programs. These efforts aim to empower communities economically and socially, helping them build resilience and overcome long-term adversities.

Today, Sonarpur Progatir Pathe stands as a testament to the power of collective vision and grassroots engagement. Its journey reflects a steady evolution from a small initiative into a dynamic organization committed to inclusive development. With a strong foundation in community participation and collaborative action, SPP continues to work towards a future where underserved populations can lead healthier, more dignified, and self-reliant lives.

FCRA PROJECT: HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT OF SEX WORKERS AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CAMPS FOR SEX WORKERS

THEMATIC AREA : SKILL DEVELOPMENT, EDUCATION, MENSTRUAL HEALTH CARE, NUTRITION

Sonarpur Progatir Pathe , a non-government organization started this project since 2023 in collaboration with Krishna Foundation, USA, when the sex workers of Kalighat and their children were in dire need and were literally starving. I am glad to report to you today that since then, we have moved on from supplying food and provide education to the sex workers' children have been able to institute a series of programs over the last three years, which have had a significant impact in the lives of this community.

In the year 2025-26, to achieve all this, we have had to hire teachers and instructors, pay for the medical services and medicine, provide nutritional snacks, rent space to conduct the educational and medical programs and hire personnel to manage and run these programs. We have been able to do so only because of the generous support we have received from you our supporters and well-wishers.

We have so much more work to do in the coming years. We need to consolidate and expand our current projects to increase our impact in the lives of the community.

Ongoing program, we have regular computer classes and digital training classes for students from classes 4 to 10. This currently runs every day. There is initiation of training of dance classes every Friday from 4-5p.m. for classes 1 to 10. There are tutorial classes after school for additional support to children in subjects like math, English and Science for senior students. We conduct periodic medical camps with doctor visits for diagnosis and treatment for the families. As we have implemented the various aid since 2023 it is still ongoing along with other measures as said above. We conduct regular medical drives to screen for the presence of risk of serious diseases like cervical cancer and provide follow up referrals. . Regular tuition classes are ongoing for the sex workers' children. During cyclones and other natural calamity struck and unforeseen circumstances we provide assistance like distributing mosquito nets, umbrellas, bedding, during the scorching heat waves table fans were provided and as the case ,maybe. We distributed sarees on the occasion of Durga Puja to 250 sex workers every year.

In the year 2026, we have taken initiative to educate pregnant women and organize pregnant mothers' awareness camps in Sundarbans. Our objective is to decrease child and maternal mortality rates. To create awareness about safe delivery of pregnant women in the remote islands of sundarbans. Improvement in personal hygiene and sanitation practices. People irrespective of caste and creed will be made aware and sensitized to understand the importance of the issue and need of the intervention so that they can come forward to access the service unhesitatingly. To spread awareness to the poor pregnant mother in sundarban, who suffered from severe malnutrition and other complication like edema, placenta previa during their pregnancy and these mother deliver such babies who always fall prey to different fatal diseases and eventually service with poor health or in leading to death. Seed Banks are provided to build and maintain kitchen garden to help empower the pregnant women as their self reliance and their source income. A decline in crude birth rates. We conduct regular medical drives to screen for the presence of risk of serious diseases like cervical cancer and provide follow up referrals. The whole program was implemented alongside collaboration with Vedanta Society of Edmonton.

CSR- Project Distribution of Nutritional food support to TB patients

Thematic Area: Nutrition

In 2026, with collaboration of State Bank of India, we have provided nutritional health support to 600 TB patients, across 6 districts of West Bengal. To improve treatment adherence and cure rates. To encourage community participation in TB elimination. To strengthen TB care through strategic partnerships. To improve health indicators such as BMI, body weight, and immunity levels. Under this initiative, we successfully have distributed nutria-basket with Nishkay mitra IDs to TB patients, recognizing that proper nutrition plays vital role in strengthening immunity, improving treatment adherence, and accelerating recovery. We conduct regular health checkups to monitor BMI of the affected persons and it was seen that along with medicines proper nutrition was to be provided with soyabeans , chattu, eggs, chola, pulses. This integrated approach not only supports the physical well-being of patients but also helps reduce stigma, enhance awareness, and strengthen community participation in TB care.

Through sustained efforts in these regions, the program aims to bridge critical gaps in healthcare access, improve recovery outcomes, and contribute meaningfully towards the goal of a TB-free India by 2030, ensuring that even the most remote and marginalized populations are not left behind.

2. JSSK Diagnostic under NRHM at Sirkabad BPHC
 Under this initiative , Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India launched the Janani–Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (JSSK), a national initiative to make available better health facilities for women and child. The initiative of JSSK would provide completely free and cashless services to pregnant women including normal deliveries and caesarean operations and sick new born (up to 30 days after birth) in Government health institutions in both rural and urban areas. Under Janani-Shishu Suraksha Karyakram we are running a Diagnostic Centre for the pregnant women at Sirkabad BPHC

3. Operation and Management of Waiting Hut for Pregnant Women

Under this scheme, the Waiting Hub is expected to accommodate 10 pregnant women at any given point of time DoH&FW is supposed to provide infrastructural set up and then handed it over to private partner selected on the basis of a bidding process, where electricity and water will be provided to the Hut free of cost by the DoH&FW. The prime role of the partnering private organization would be to operationalize and manage the waiting hut. This includes provide round the clock service to the pregnant women kept in the Hut along with timely management of obstetric complications. Initially in West Bengal the Waiting Hut is initiated in three remote blocks like Gosaba, Sandeshkhali II and Patharpratima. These blocks belong to geographically inaccessible India Sundarbans. Travelling is nearly impossible because of low tides as many ferry services stop. Later, Waiting Hut has been established in other backward and hard to reach districts of West Bengal like , Dakshin Dinajpur,.Alipurduar,Diamond Harbour Health District, South 24 Parganas. Presently the rate of institutional delivery in this region is at 47 percent¹.Therefore this Waiting Hut is surely a welcoming step by the state government to ensure timely and quality obstetric care for safe motherhood. In a recent call for proposal the State department has called for another 10 Waiting Huts in other inaccessible parts of the state. This initiative is under the NHM scheme of the government.

4. NTEP Schemes District Tuberculosis

The Revised National TB Control Programme (RNTCP), based on the internationally recommended Directly Observed Treatment Short-course (DOTS) strategy, was launched in 1997 expanded across the country in a phased manner with support from World Bank and other development partners. Full nation-wide coverage was achieved in March 2006. In terms of treatment of patients, RNTCP has been recognized as the largest and the fastest expanding TB control programme in the world. RNTCP is presently being implemented throughout the country. Under the programme, diagnosis and treatment facilities are provided free of cost to all TB patients. We are working as partner and implementing various schemes at the following locations to provide services to the TB patients. Under this the sputum transport services are executed.

Future Plans and Action Plan

In the upcoming year, our organization will expand and strengthen its community-based interventions in the Kalighat region, and North & South 24 Parganas with a focus on sustainable development, inclusion, and measurable impact.

- **Adolescent Skill Development Initiatives:**
*We aim to implement structured skill development programs for adolescents (aged 14–18 years), targeting at least **100 beneficiaries** in the first phase. Training will focus on vocational skills, digital literacy, and life skills to enhance employability and self-reliance.*
- **Promotion of Sports and Extracurricular Engagement:**
*A football-based extracurricular program will be introduced to engage **50+ children and adolescents**, promoting physical fitness, discipline, teamwork, and leadership development.*
- **Establishment of an Old Age Care Facility:**
*The organization plans to establish an old age home with a capacity to support **25–30 elderly individuals**, ensuring access to safe shelter, healthcare, nutrition, and psychosocial support.*
- **Strengthening of Orphanage Management and Services:**
*We will enhance the operational efficiency and quality of care within the orphanage, ensuring **100% access to formal education**, regular health check-ups, and improved emotional and social support systems for all resident children.*
- **Community Awareness on Education and Healthcare:**
*A series of awareness campaigns and outreach programs will be conducted, reaching approximately **500 community members**, to promote the importance of education, preventive healthcare, hygiene, and access to public health services.*
- **Integrated Early Child care and adolescent empowerment:**

Focusing on children and adolescents in tea garden areas of North Bengal and the Sundarbans face multiple vulnerabilities due to poverty, remoteness and ecological risks. Under-nutrition among children, high anemia among adolescent girls. Enhanced leadership, confidence, and decision-making abilities among adolescents, especially girls. Increased community awareness on gender equality, child protection, and health-seeking behavior.
